The LWAP program allows states to provide up to \$400 in additional unemployment benefits each week to eligible claimants.

In addition to the normal requirements for unemployment programs, each claimant must also self-certify that their unemployment or under employment is caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, and the claimant must be receiving at least \$100 in unemployment benefits from one of the following programs:

- Regular Unemployment Compensation
- Unemployment Compensation for Federal Employees (UCFE)
- Unemployment Compensation for Ex-Service Members (UCX)
- Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation (PEUC)
- Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA)
- Extended Benefits (EB)
- Short-Time Compensation (STC)
- Trade Readjustment Allowances (TRA)
- Payments under the Self-Employment Assistance (SEA)

Funding Sources

The federal portion (\$300) of LWAP is funded through a \$44 billion dollar allocation from FEMA's Disaster Relief Funds (DRF). Governor Kelly has proposed funding the state's portion (\$100) with Coronavirus Relief Funds (CRF) received through the CARES Act.

Additionally, the state of Kansas will apply for an administrative grant for the implementation cost of the LWAP program.
