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The executive committee of the second Strengthening People and Revitalizing Kansas (SPARK) Taskforce met for the first time on Wednesday, June 23. The Taskforce, originally established in May 2020 to oversee the distribution of funds from the federal CARES Act, is charged with leading Kansas forward in continued recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic through allocation of federal funds coming to Kansas through the American Rescue Plan Act.

New guidelines regarding available funding from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) are released each week. The Office of Recovery will keep you informed of relevant resources, funding and key program developments, not just across ARPA, but also under the CARES Act and the Consolidated Appropriations Act (HR

Community Impact Monthly Child Tax Credit Online Tool

Non-filer Sign-up Tool freefile IT'S FAST. IT'S SAFE. IT'S FREE. Resources This is a Free File Fillable Forms product. FAQs Return to IRS Submit information about your household so the IRS can determine if you are eligible for advance payments of your 2021 Child Tax Credit and any 2020 Recovery Rebate Credit you may be entitled to receive. This free online form is designed to provide the IRS with basic information about you and your dependents. When entering your dependents, you'll need to indicate which of your dependents are qualifying children for the 2021 Child Tax Credit by using the check box provided on the form. If you did not receive the first or second Economic Impact Payment or the full amount you were entitled to receive, you may use this online form to claim the 2020 Recovery Rebate Credit. This free online form also allows you to provide banking information which the IRS will use to direct deposit any payment you are entitled to receive.

The U.S. Department of the Treasury and the Internal Revenue Service announced the availability of a new online tool to help families who normally aren't required to file an income tax return to register quickly for the expanded and newly-advanceable Child Tax Credit from the American Rescue Plan. The new tool is part of a larger effort to help more families obtain <u>advance Child Tax Credit payments</u>.

Available through IRS.gov, the new <u>Non-filer Sign-up Tool</u> is for people who did not file an income tax return for 2019 or 2020 and did not use the IRS Non-filers tool last year to register for Economic Impact Payments. The tool enables them to quickly provide required information about themselves and their qualifying children age 17 and under.

Users of the tool can also choose to enter direct deposit bank information so the IRS can deposit the payments directly into their checking or savings account. Eligible individuals who filed a 2019 or 2020 tax return or used the IRS Non-filers tool last year to register for Economic Impact Payments do not need to take any action to receive their advance Child Tax Credit payments beginning in July.

This tool, an update of last year's IRS Non-filers tool, is also designed to help eligible individuals who don't normally file income tax returns register for the \$1,400 third round of Economic Impact Payments (also known as stimulus checks) and claim the Recovery Rebate Credit for any amount of the first two rounds of Economic Impact Payments they may have missed.

Program Spotlight

FCC Emergency Connectivity Fund



Last week, the FCC <u>announced</u> the initial filing window for the <u>Emergency</u> <u>Connectivity Fund</u>, a \$7.17 billion program that will help schools and libraries provide the tools and services their communities need for remote learning during the COVID-19 emergency period.

From June 29, 2021 to August 13, 2021, eligible schools and libraries can apply for financial support to purchase connected devices like laptops and tablets, Wi-Fi hotspots, modems, routers, and broadband connectivity to meet unmet needs for off-campus use by students, school staff, and library patrons during the COVID-19 emergency period. During this application filing window, eligible schools and libraries, in addition to consortia of schools and libraries, can submit requests for funding to purchase eligible equipment and services between July 1, 2021, and June 30, 2022.

The FCC will host a <u>webinar on June 25, at 1 pm CT</u> on <u>fcc.gov/live</u> to provide an overview of the Emergency Connectivity Fund, including applicant eligibility, supported equipment and services, reasonable support amounts, and the application and invoicing processes.

American Rescue Plan Act

- The application form for American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Local Fiscal Relief Funds (LFRF), awarded by the U.S. Department of Treasury and disbursed from the State of Kansas, is now available. A link to the application was emailed directly to NEU contacts. If you did not receive a message, please submit an updated email through the RO <u>inquiry form</u>.
 - Funds will be distributed to those who have completed the application and certification process, with initial payment processing beginning on July 1, 2021.
 - For the State to fulfill the Treasury's deadline for distributing NEU awards, all applications must be completed by **July 26, 2021**.

 KDADS received noticed of award for the <u>Mental Health Block Grant (ARPA)</u> and <u>Substance Abuse Block Grant (ARPA)</u>. The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) is distributing \$3 billion across the country in American Rescue Plan funding — the largest aggregate amount of funding to date for its mental health and substance use block grant programs
